In FY 2018, there were 10 examinations for the Fundamentals of Geology and 5 examinations for the Practice of Geology. Based on these to the increased fee for the Fundamentals of Geology would yield an additional \$500 (10 exams increase) and the increased fee for the Practice of Geology would yield an additional \$250 (5 x \$50 increase), for a total increase of \$750.

Examination fees are instituted by the testing organization (Association of State B of Geology), collected by the NH Board of Professional Geologists and forwarded the testing organization for developing and administering the examinations.

6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

This proposed rule is intended to readopt without change an interim rule which was effective 10/4/18 and is scheduled to expire 4/2/19. The proposed rule continues to implement amendments to RSA 319-C:2, IV and V, defining "journeyman electrician" and "master electrician", respectively, and RSA 319-C:2-a, on supervision of apprentice electricians, which went into effect June 12, 2018 as part of Chapter 243 of the Laws of 2018 (HB 1327). The amendments to Elec 404.05 on supervision contained in the interim rule, and now proposed to be readopted, specify supervision standards that are in line with the new statutory provisions, which provides for the supervision of apprentices by master electricians, and the supervision of up to 2 apprentices by journeymen electricians with at least one year of experience. The proposed amendments also address the supervision of an apprentice electrician by a journeyman with less than one year of experience.

6. (b) Brief description of the groups affected:

This proposal affects all apprentice electricians seeking supervision, as well as journeyman and master electricians who seek to provide such supervision.

8. Summary explaining the effect of the rule:

The proposed new rule, He-W 639, describes services, employer subsidies and employment support services available through the Granite Workforce Pilot Program (GWPP) to eligible Granite Advantage beneficiaries. The pilot program will use federal funds from the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) program to assist Granite Advantage beneficiaries in meeting the 100 hour per month community engagement requirement.

In 2018, Chapter Law 342 (SB 313) replaced the New Hampshire Health Protection Program (NHHPP), which expires on 12/31/18, with the Granite Advantage Health Care Program (Granite Advantage) under RSA 126-AA effective on January 1, 2019, and it establishes the GWPP to assist Granite Advantage beneficiaries in meeting the community engagement requirements. In accordance with SB 313, the Department of Health and Human Services filed a waiver amendment and extension with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to continue its existing authority to implement work and community engagement requirements as a condition of continued eligibility under section 1902(a)(10)(A)(i)(VIII) [42 U.S.C 1396(a)(10)(A)(i)(VIII)] of the Social Security Act. The waiver was approved by CMS on November 30, 2018. The Department is entering into interim rulemaking pursuant to RSA 541-A:19, I(a) in order to meet the NH statutory requirement to implement the Granite Advantage program and the GWPP on 1/1/19.

8. Summary explaining the effect of the rule:

The proposed new rule, He-W 837, describes the community engagement requirements for the Granite Advantage program, exemptions from the work and community engagement program, qualifying activities for community engagement, impacts of noncompliance with the community engagement requirement, and how to cure deficit community engagement hours.

In 2018, Chapter Law 342 (SB 313) replaced the New Hampshire Health Protection Program (NHHPP), which expires on 12/31/18, with the Granite Advantage Health Care Program (Granite Advantage) under RSA 126-AA effective on January 1, 2019. In accordance with SB 313, the Department of Health and Human Services filed a waiver amendment and extension with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to continue its existing authority to implement work and community engagement requirements as a condition of continued eligibility under section 1902(a)(10)(A)(i)(VIII) [42 U.S.C 1396(a)(10)(A)(i)(VIII)] of the Social Security Act. The waiver was approved by CMS on November 30, 2018. The Department is entering into interim rulemaking in order to meet the NH statutory requirement to implement the program on 1/1/19.
